




#### Post-2020 Election fallout

Do you think State Legislators who were part of a lawsuit to overturn the election results should be allowed to be seated in the Legislature, or not?








### Militias, the GOP and Meshawn Maddock









#### The Battle Over COVID


Do you strongly approve, somewhat approve, somewhat disapprove or strongly disapprove of the job Governor Whitmer is doing handling the coronavirus?


Do you strongly approve, somewhat approve, somewhat disapprove or strongly disapprove of the job Republicans in the State Legislature are doing handling the coronavirus?




## **Checking in on the Women** from Michigan...and the Man from Scranton


Do you strongly approve, somewhat approve, somewhat disapprove or strongly disapprove of Secretary of State Jocelyn Benson's job performance?
