





Transparency, Accountability Reform Extremely Popular



Would you strongly support, somewhat support, somewhat oppose, or strongly oppose a policy requiring more financial disclosure from lawmakers?






GOP vs. Whitmer Funding Stunts Not Popular


Do you support or oppose the Legislature refusing to allocate federal coronavirus relief unless the Governor gives up her emergency powers?

Generally speaking, when it comes to coronavirus do you think Michigan is moving too fast when it comes to reopening the state, not fast enough, or at about the right speed?







Michigan Dems Continue to Outshine GOP

While respondents may be split on Biden, the Dems in the state's highest offices continue to receive solid support. Their GOP colleagues? Not so much.


Do you strongly approve, somewhat approve, somewhat disapprove or strongly disapprove of President Joe Biden's job performance?





Do you strongly approve, somewhat approve, somewhat disapprove or strongly disapprove of Attorney General Dana Nessel's job performance?

Do you strongly approve, somewhat approve, somewhat disapprove or strongly disapprove of Secretary of State Jocelyn Benson's job performance?






Michigan Political Heat


