Q1 Of the following issues, which one would you say is most important to you personally: strengthening the economy, increasing the minimum wage, improving Michigan’s infrastructure, ensuring access to safe abortions, protecting voting rights, investing in K-12 education, reforming the criminal justice system, reducing crime, immigration, or something else?
