- Q1** When thinking about the 2022 election, are you very enthusiastic about voting, somewhat enthusiastic, or not at all enthusiastic?
- Very enthusiastic* 66%
 - Somewhat enthusiastic* 16%
 - Not at all enthusiastic* 13%
 - Not sure* 4%
- Q2** Are you or is anyone in your household a current or former member of a labor union?
- Yes* 44%
 - No* 56%
- Q3** Do you think the 2020 Presidential election results were legitimate, or not?
- Legitimate* 52%
 - Not legitimate* 29%
 - Not sure* 18%
- Q4** Do you believe that President Trump illegally attempted to overturn the 2020 election, or not?

 - Not sure* 7%
- Q7** Now that Roe v. Wade has been overturned, a 1931 Michigan law will make abortion illegal pending a lawsuit challenging the ban, including in cases of rape and incest. Do you support or oppose efforts to repeal this law and keep abortion legal in Michigan?
- Support* 58%
 - Oppose* 28%
 - Not sure* 14%
- Q8** When thinking about the 2022 election, does the issue of abortion make you very motivated to vote, somewhat motivated to vote, or not at all motivated to vote?
- Very motivated to vote* 57%
 - Somewhat motivated to vote* 18%
 - Not at all motivated to vote* 20%
 - Not sure* 6%





Q9 Recently, President Biden signed the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act, which includes key changes to the country's gun policies including closing what is known as the "boyfriend loophole" that allows abusive boyfriends to obtain guns where abusive husbands are restricted, enhances background checks for people ages 18-21, invests in mental health services, and invests in state Extreme Risk Protection Order laws.
