

## Michigan Survey Results

**Q1** Last week, Michigan lawmakers approved a nearly \$1 billion supplemental spending bill that includes business incentives, an affordable housing tax credit program, community revitalization grants, law enforcement training, and funds to prevent water shutoffs. Do you strongly support, somewhat support, somewhat oppose, or strongly oppose this bill?

*Strongly support* ..... 38%  
*Somewhat support*..... 28%  
*Somewhat oppose*..... 13%

**Q2** Michigan lawmakers also voted to expand Michigan's Earned Income Tax Credit to help low-income families. Do you strongly support, somewhat support, somewhat oppose, or strongly oppose expanding Michigan's Earned Income Tax Credit?

**Q4** During her State of the State address, Governor Gretchen Whitmer proposed additional priorities to tackle in 2023. I am going to list some of these priorities and ask if you strongly support, somewhat support, somewhat oppose, or strongly oppose the legislature and Governor Whitmer taking action on these issues. Here's the first one: free, public preschool for all of Michigan's 4-year-olds.

**Q11** Here's the next one: investing in tutoring, after-school programs, and other education initiatives to help get Michigan's children back on track.

**Q12** Here's the next one: enacting universal background checks for firearm sales.

**Q14** Here's the last one: enacting extreme risk protection to allow family members and law enforcement to petition the courts to temporarily remove firearms from people who pose a serious risk to themselves or others.

**Q16** The beginning of this month marked the second anniversary of the January 6th violent attack on our country at the US Capitol. Multiple members of the current Michigan legislature supported or participated in Trump's insurrection and efforts to overturn the election in some way. Do you believe these lawmakers should continue to serve as lawmakers in the state legislature, or not?

**Q17** Three current Michigan lawmakers who have regularly supported Trump's lie about winning the election were present in D.C. or at the Capitol on January 6, 2021. Do you believe these lawmakers should continue to serve as lawmakers in the state legislature, or not?

**Q18** Attorney General Dana Nessel has announced she will reopen the investigation into the attempt by some Michigan Republicans to install false electors who would go against Michigan voters to cast electoral college votes for Trump instead of Biden in 2020. Four current Michigan lawmakers were involved in that attempt or reportedly told Trump's team they would support appointing an alternate slate of Trump electors. Do you support Attorney General Nessel reopening this investigation, or not?

**Q19** Do you believe the lawmakers who were involved in or reportedly supported attempting to appoint an alternate slate of Trump electors should continue to serve Michiganders in the state legislature or Congress, or not?

**Q20** A group dedicated to ending suicide among LGBTQ young people recently released a survey saying that nearly half of LGBTQ young people in Michigan have seriously considered suicide in the past year and 15 percent have attempted suicide. Do you believe the Michigan legislature should take action to provide support and resources to LGBTQ young people, or not?
