Q1 When thinking about who you're going to vote for, do you think it is very important, somewhat important, or not at all important that the candidate you are voting for believes the same things about LGBTQ+ issues that you do?

- Very important* 44%
- Somewhat important*..... 28%
- Not at all important*..... 21%
- Not sure* 6%

Q2 The Michigan Legislature passed a wide variety of bills this year. I am going to list some of what these bills do and ask if you strongly support, somewhat support, somewhat oppose, or strongly oppose the Legislature passing those bills, or if you're not sure. Here's the first one: getting rid of Michigan's right-to-work law, which undercuts the power of unions across the state. Do you strongly support, somewhat support, somewhat oppose, or strongly oppose the Legislature getting rid of Michigan's right-to-work law?

- Strongly support* 31%
- Somewhat support*..... 21%
- Somewhat oppose*..... 14%
- Strongly oppose*..... 23%

Q3 Here's the next one: passing common sense gun violence prevention laws including requiring universal background checks; requiring gun owners to safely store their firearms; preventing people convicted of domestic violence from possessing firearms for eight years; and allowing family members, healthcare professionals, and law enforcement agencies to temporarily remove firearms from people who pose a significant risk of hurting themselves or others. Do you strongly support, somewhat support, somewhat oppose, or strongly oppose the Legislature passing these common sense gun violence prevention measures?

Q4 Here's the next one: passing the Reproductive Health Act, which works to ensure all Michiganders have access to abortion care, by removing many anti-abortion obstacles that may prevent care. This includes ensuring those with pre-existing conditions can get insurance, ensuring LGBTQ+ Michiganders can get insurance, and allowing kids to stay on their parents' insurance until they are 26 years old. Do you strongly support, somewhat support, somewhat oppose, or strongly oppose the Legislature codifying the Affordable Care Act into Michigan law?
