Q1 When thinking about who you're going to vote for, do you think it is very important, somewhat important, or not at all important that the candidate you are voting for believes the same things about LGBTQ+ issues that you do?

<i>Very important</i>	42%

Q7 Former President Donald Trump has recently made many statements as he campaigns in the Republican presidential primaries. I am going to read you several of those statements and ask if they make you more likely or less likely to support former President Trump, or if they don't make a difference. Here's the first one: Trump has said migrants are "poisoning the blood of our country" and has pledged to enact the largest deportation operation in American history, and end birthright citizenship which would take away the right for someone born in the US to automatically be a United States citizen. Does hearing this make you more likely or less likely to vote for Donald Trump, or does it not make a difference?

- More likely*..... 34%
- Less likely* 47%

Q8 Here's the next one: Trump took credit for appointing Supreme Court justices who paved the way for overturning Roe v Wade, saying: "I did it and I'm proud to have done it." This decision has led to abortion bans across the country.
