




January 2025 Lake Effect Poll Memo Michigan Opinion on Minimum Wage and Paid Sick Leave Proposed Legislation Changes

Key Takeaway

A majority of Michiganders support the laws taking effect next month increasing the state's minimum wage, phasing out the tipped wage for service workers, and guaranteeing at least 72 hours of paid sick leave.

- An overwhelming majority of Democrats and African-American voters are in support.
- A majority of women, who make up three-quarters of tipped workers in Michigan, are slightly more in support than men.
- A slim majority of Republicans are also in support.


